Fees are set at the AGM. For 2011 the joining fee for both Full and Associate\*\* Members is **£10**, which is also the first year subscription. If you join after 30<sup>th</sup> September, this will also cover the following year.

For 2011 the renewal subscription fee is **£10** for both Full & Associate Members.

\*\* Known as 'Wannabe', for those who have completed at least 50 marathons/ultras.

**NB.** An associate member has full voting rights, and is eligible for all club activities. The one exception is that members may not purchase or wear club kit until they have completed 100 marathons.

Note 1:

If you are already 1<sup>st</sup> Claim for another Club in the UK, you must resign from that club. This process will move you over to the '100 Marathon Club'.

Note 2:

As a 1<sup>st</sup> claim member you are expected to register for an England Athletics Competition License. This process is handled by your club, and currently costs £5, payable on 1<sup>st</sup> April each year. If eligible to join 1<sup>st</sup> claim, you may include the EA fee with this application.

Note 3:

To facilitate easier handing of Subscriptions, you have the option to pay for 5 years membership up front, receiving a 25% discount, ie. you pay for 4 years, but receive 5!

Note 4:

We realise that you may have run marathons for many years, and may not have full details, that said we encourage members to supply the following information.

Exact Date; Venue, Distance; Type (road or trail); actual time taken

(An application may be turned down/delayed unless an acceptable level of information is supplied)

An excel spreadsheet (preferred) or table within a word document is the best form, but we will try to work with what ever you supply us, including a paper list.

A working template for both excel and word can be downloaded from the club website.

On receipt, the list is checked for validity, individual results will only be checked if we have reason to. All events are then categorised into 3 sections. ie. Road Marathons, Trail Marathons & Ultras

Note 5:

For membership and ongoing statistics, the following constitutes qualifying events.

A road marathon is an event that is prominently on a 'road' surface, and has been measured to athletic standards to be 26m 385y (42.195km). Track marathons also count as 'road'.

A trail marathon is anything else from approx 26.2 miles up to 26.99 miles.

(We give a concession to LDWA (walking) events, where a quoted distance of 26 miles is acceptable)

An Ultra is any event that is 27 miles or greater on any surface.

All 3 types of events, must be advertised in advance, and hold a recognised athletics/LDWA permit to cover 'Public Liability Insurance'. The event must have 5 entrants and 3 finishers.

Generally speaking, if it's shown on the club website ( [www.100marathonclub.org.uk](http://www.100marathonclub.org.uk) ), then it's a qualifying event.

Please note: We are not a regulatory authority, but reserve the right to have rules for the club that protect the integrity of the Marathon distance.

More complete details can be found on the website.

Note 6:

If you are not a resident of the UK or Ireland, then we apply the following extra rules for membership.

- 1) To apply for associate membership, the applicant must have completed at least 5 qualifying events in the UK or Ireland.
- 2) To apply for Full membership, or to move up from associate to full membership, the applicant must have completed at least 10 qualifying events in the UK or Ireland.
